Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Sue Chambers read the treasurer's report.

New Members: Denise called up our newest members Mildred Rios and Andre Zatarian. Denise presented them with their OTHG name badges and playfully interviewed both of them. Mildred owns a 48 Chevy P/U and Andre has a 54 Ford P/U.

Ralph encouraged the approval to move to a more appropriate lawyer and the approval of the total fees for this purpose.

M/S/P Reduced for this year only the percentage of Streak profits to be given to our charities from 60% to 40% in order to free up some additional monies for incorporating.
